The Bottom-Mount Refrigerator

First introduced in the 1950s, the Bottom-Mount Refrigerator is more popular than ever in new kitchen designs. The main difference is that the bottom door has been transformed into a spacious drawer, which pulls out easily to display everything stored inside.



The Hi/Low Range

The Hi/Low Range was the very first oven that utilizes space well, even in a small kitchen, and it is one of the most requested replacements today. Although the top oven has been replaced with a microwave oven, manufacturers have added convection technology to the microwave in order to provide some of the same benefits.



Front Load Washers & Dryers

Introduced more than four decades ago, Front-Load machines are the number one choice today, and for good reason. Not only have capacities increased—they are available in "super-ultra" capacity—but front-load washing machines now use significantly less water per cycle. On average, front-load machines use 16 gallons of water per load, versus the 55 gallons used by top-load washers. And dryers have not only gained capacity, but speed as well, providing an overall energy saving. Furthermore, there's no reason to hide modern machines in the basement! They come in a variety of colors and have accessories such as pedestals and stacking kits for flexibility with design.
